

approximately fourteen hours later. On the 21st of October we continue on to Zimbabwe, Africa.

5. In Zimbabwe we have reservations provided through the Africa Adventure Company to go on safari in several remote areas of the country for the purpose of seeing and photographing exotic animals (we hope) not seen in the wild in other parts of the world. There are numerous flights within Zimbabwe that we have scheduled others (listed on the itinerary), as well as others that will take us in small craft deeper into remote park areas.

6. We will leave Zimbabwe on November 3, 1998 on British Airways flights operated by Comair, via Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe with transit through Johannesburg, South Africa and onward to Cape Town. The flight information is detailed in the exhibit annexed hereto. We leave Cape Town on November 7, 1998 at 5:05 PM on South African Airways, flight 338, connecting through Johannesburg, for South African Airways flight 201, arriving in New York City on November 8, 1998 at 7:30 AM.

7. Between October 20, 1998 and November 4, 1998 we will either be in remote areas of Africa or in transit between various remote points in Africa. Because of our location, or because we will be in transit, it will be impossible for us to receive mail.

8. Between October 20, and November 4, 1998, due of our travel itinerary, we will be unable to appear at any

American Embassy or Consulate. We have no "down time" in any major city prior to November 4, 1998. Due to the time and expense of such travel, we long ago allocated our time in this period to remote areas.

9. Because of our travel plans both [fiancee] and I have requested absentee ballots from the Board of Elections.

As of this date, we have been continually informed that they are not yet available.

10. I have voted routinely in general elections for 20 years and I intended to do so again in 1998. Indeed, the only other time I was out of the country at election time, in 1988, I made a point of going to the American Embassy in New Delhi, India, in order to cast my ballot. This option is not available to me now.

11. [Fiancee] recently changed her registration, due to her move from one part of Manhattan to another, in order that she may vote in the upcoming general.

12. I believe that [fiancee] and I have a right to vote in the general election on November 3, 1998 by absentee ballot, and both I and [fiancee] wish to exercise that right.
